



Mr. Davis stated that he and Mr. Lowe had discussed the feasibility of leasing the former landfill property for use as a solar farm which would produce a monthly revenue stream.

Mr. Lowe stated that Medford has experience with solar farms and added that the former landfill property has a “southerly face.”

Mr. McComas stated that he has heard that tax assessors can reassess properties without the municipality undertaking an expensive revaluation.

Mr. Gertner stated that the matter has been proposed in the legislature and “is not a law yet.”

Mr. Gertner suggested seeking a request for proposal to hire consultants to seek cellular phone carriers to place additional antennae on the water tower before the exterior painting occurs.
